

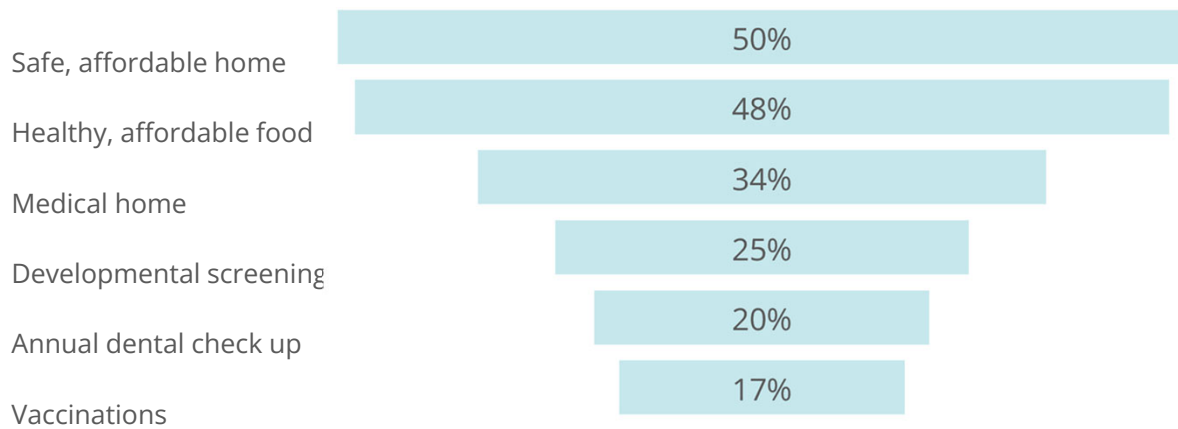

Having a safe, affordable home, and healthy, affordable food were the highest priorities overall.

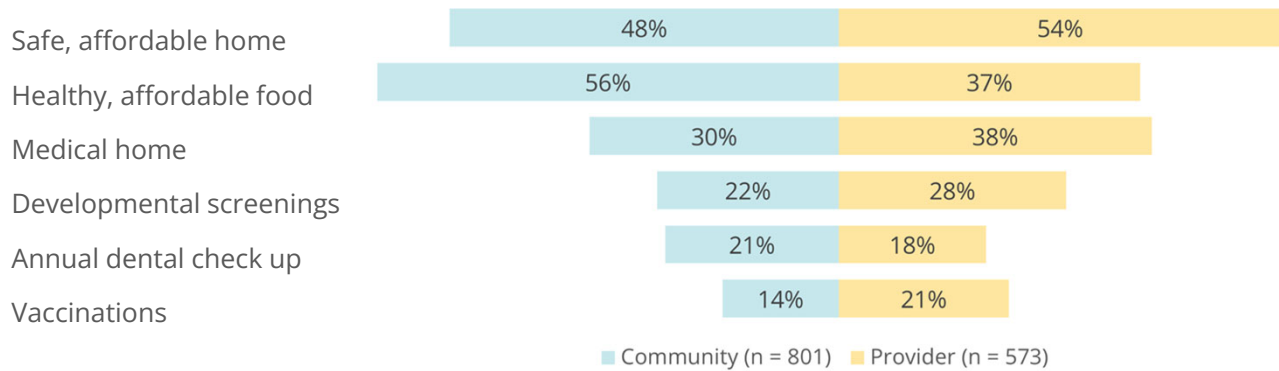

## Children's health - NPM rankings for community members and providers

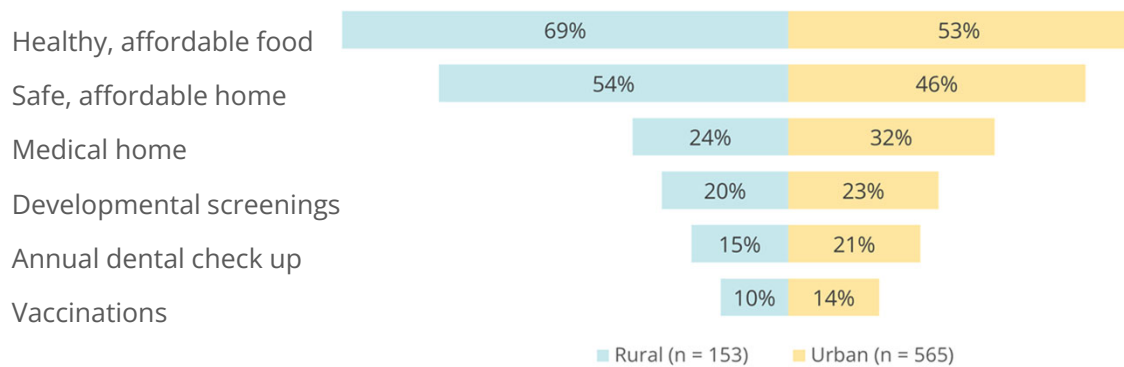
Community members ranked access to healthy, affordable food highest, while providers ranked having a safe, affordable home highest.

Top priorities for non-Hispanic non-White community members (n = 72):

1. Healthy, affordable food (65%)
2. Safe, stable, affordable home (36%)
3. Medical home (28%)
4. Annual dental check up (22%)
5. Developmental screenings (18%)
6. Vaccinations (15%)

Top priorities for Hispanic community members (n = 188):

1. Healthy, affordable food (47%)
2. Safe, stable, affordable home (39%)
3. Medical home (36%)
4. Annual dental check up (29%)
5. Developmental screenings (27%)
6. Vaccinations (11%)

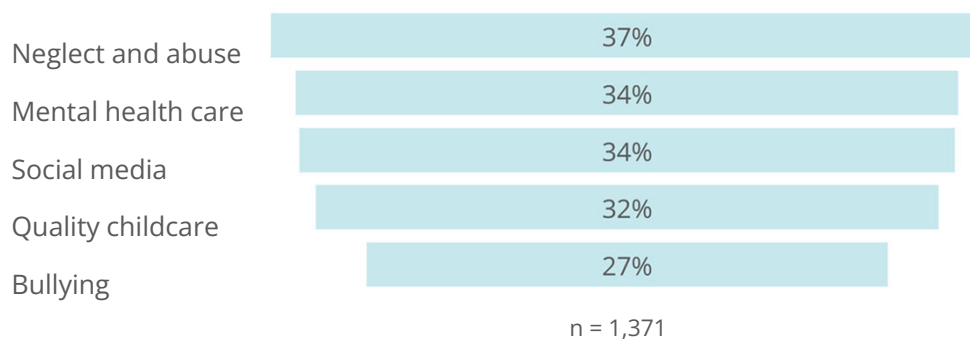
Top priorities for non-Hispanic White community members (n = 500):

1. Healthy, affordable food (58%)
2. Safe, stable, affordable home (53%)
3. Medical home (29%)
4. Developmental screenings (21%)
5. Annual dental check up (16%)
6. Vaccinations (14%)

## Children's health - other issue rankings overall

Preventing child neglect and abuse was ranked highest overall.

## Children's health - other issue rankings for community members and providers

### Top other issues for community members (n = 792):

1. Child neglect and abuse (34%)
2. Social media (33%)
3. Bullying (31%)
4. Quality childcare (30%)
5. High-quality, affordable mental health care (27%)

### Top other issues for providers (n = 579):

1. High-quality, affordable mental health care (43%)
2. Child neglect and abuse (40%)
3. Social media (35%)
4. Quality childcare (35%)
5. High-quality, affordable medical care (26%)

### Top other issues for rural community members (n = 153):

1. Child neglect and abuse (43%)
2. Bullying (35%)
3. Social media (31%)
4. High-quality, affordable mental health care (26%)
5. High-quality, affordable medical care (22%)

### Top other issues for urban community members (n = 565):

1. Social media (33%)
2. Child neglect and abuse (32%)
3. Quality childcare (31%)
4. High-quality affordable mental health care (27%)
5. High-quality, affordable medical care (23%)

2. High-quality, affordable medical care (31%)
3. Bullying (29%)
4. Social media (24%)
5. Child neglect and abuse (21%)

Top other issues for Hispanic community members (n = 188):

1. Bullying (36%)
2. Child neglect and abuse (30%)
3. Quality childcare (30%)
4. Social media (27%)
5. High-quality, affordable medical care (25%)

Top other issues for non-Hispanic White community members (n = 500):

1. Child neglect and abuse (39%)
2. Social media (35%)
3. High-quality, affordable mental health care (32%)
4. Bullying (30%)
5. Quality childcare (29%)

## DHHS recommendations

Child health domain:

- [Medical home](#)
  - Addressing root causes and potential for impact.
  - Consistent high prioritization across community and provider survey as well as across race/ethnicity.
  - High potential to address other concerns identified in the MCH Needs Assessment survey.
  - Building the foundation.
- [Developmental screening](#)
  - Stepping stone to services.
  - Ability to leverage and support existing systems.
  - "Dipping the toe" and serving as a gateway.
- [Preventive dental visit](#)
  - Oral health is the gateway to overall health and wellness.
  - Tooth decay is the most common chronic disease in children.
